
Glamping Pods

PRE-HISTORIC BRITAIN

Set in 3300 BC - 1200 BC

Step back in time and join a Stone Age hunter gather tribe living 10,000 years ago. In order to survive in this rich, yet hostile, landscape, you must start learning skills you would need to thrive.

This ancient environment is full of dangers and variables, so your students will need their wits about them...





Cave Art & Nature Awareness





Create and use horsehair brushes and simple sponges from moss using natural pigments. Becoming aware of our surroundings in Nature Awareness to learn more about what nature has to offer.

Archery & Archaeological Dig





Return to the modern world to explore archaeology and what may be lying underground. During the archery session students will learn how to shoot a bow and will have the opportunity to become a master hunter.



Fire Lighting & Shelter Construction





Participants will learn the importance and uses fire had for our ancestors. During the Shelter Construction participants will work as a tribe to build an effective shelter.

Prehistoric Campfire





During the evening campfire session participants will gain an understanding of prehistoric glue and what it would be used for. Crushing charcoal, preparing seeds/wool and heating of resin will create a thermoplastic glue.

VIKING EXPLORER

AD 800 - AD 1150

Spend the day learning what it was like to live as a Viking. Learn what made the Vikings such formidable invaders; experience how the Viking warriors travelled across the seas and navigated.

Next, learn about their skilled manufacture, stories telling and preparation for battle.



Theft of Thor's Hammer





During this evening activity, embark on a perilous and challenging journey to steal the legendary Thor's Hammer. Groups will follow a set of challenges to locate and steal Mjölnir. This is the perfect end to a Viking school trip day!

Manufacture & Bushcraft





Participants will learn the importance of the many uses fire had for the Vikings. Then, learn the skill of cordage making from natural fibres to create a length of cord. Using this cord, they will bind together a piece of leather that they have worked.



Runes & Longboat Building





Find and translating message written in Viking Runes to uncover an age-old Nordic tale. The group will embark on a long sea journey, building their own Viking Longboat and learn what made them such efficient sea goers.

Archery & Throwing





Archery was important to the Viking way of life: it gave the advantage on the battlefield and the ability to maintain a safe distance away during hunting. Guided practice to begin, and then various engaging team games and a challenge of hunting a rabbit target.



Dress the Viking & Archaeological Dig





Groups will make their way down into the archaeological dig site armed with excavation tools and record sheet. Then, children will learn what clothing and weapons the Viking carried,

ROMAN INVADER

AD 43 - AD 410

Visit Britain 2000 years ago and spend the day discovering what it was like to live as a Roman.

Learn what made the Romans a successful invading force, from forming Testudos to creating Tabula. Students will take part in a variety of activities to bring the classroom topic to life.



Legion & Dress the Solider





Embark on a journey to become part of the Roman legion. The must pass the physical training and prepare marching formations to earn their uniform.

Archery & Throwing & Siege





During the session participants will learn how to shoot a bow and how the romans used and trained with the bow to conquer empires. Guided practice to begin and then various engaging team games.

Archaeological Dig & Bushcraft





Discover Archaeology and uncover more about Roman Britain by digging into the ground. Heading into the woods, participants will learn the importance and many uses fire had for Roman Britain.

Cart Building & Manufacture





Manufacture everyday Roman items including leather pouches to take home with them. The groups will also need to use their problem solving and communication skills to build a cart that will carry the items along a Roman road.

Labours of Hercules





During this evening activity, embark on a journey following in the footsteps of Hercules the divine hero in Greek mythology. Groups will follow a set of challenges to complete together.





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
